Chief Warrant Officer MILLER is cited for outstanding achievement while serving as Communications Officer, Coast Guard Greater Antilles Section (GANTSEC), San Juan, Puerto Rico from June 1990 to June 1993. Displaying an exceptional ability to combine keen administrative skills with a broad knowledge of communications equipment, Chief Warrant Officer MILLER saved the Coast Guard and other federal agencies thousands of dollars annually. Under his direction, the GANTSEC Communications Center was relocated in one day - with all systems on line and no disruption of service to the field. He was instrumental in obtaining the most sophisticated communications equipment available, including what is considered "the" state-of-the-art multi-channel recorder. Because of his success with this equipment, the Seventh Coast Guard District is proposing it for adoption as the Coast Guard standard. His expertise with the Automatic Digital Network (AUTODIN) system prevented overload during Operation Desert Storm, and ensured GANTSEC's ability to operate around all wartime "minimizes." By establishing Air Station Borinquen's AUTODIN message routing, he improved service and reduced their workload forty percent. Chief Warrant Officer MILLER's dedication, judgment, and devotion to duty are most heartily commended and are in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Coast Guard.
